Winter is here! Along with the holidays, snow, and hot cocoa come many viruses, coughs, and colds. Please help us reduce the spread of germs with proper handwashing. National Handwashing Awareness Week is <u>December 1-7, 2024</u>. According to the Center for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), the following steps can help keep everyone healthy this winter season.

Wash hands with soap and water for at least 20 seconds

Singing the song, "Happy Birthday" is at least that long

Dry your hands using a clean towel or air dry them

Wash hands before food preparation, before eating a meal, after using the restroom, after sneezing/blowing nose, after leaving a public space, etc

What's in season during December?

Brussel Sprouts - wash clean, slice in half, drizzle with olive oil, salt & pepper. Bake at 375 degrees for 30 minutes on a lined baking pan. Delicious!

Easy Citrus Cranberry Sauce

1 package of fresh cranberries (usually sold in 2 lb bags), washed clean

1/2 cup granulated sugar - Feel free to adjust to preferred taste

1/2 cup water

ı fresh orange ; juice and peel or zest

Bring water and sugar to a light boil, add cranberries and let sit for about 5 min, just until they begin to burst open. Turn off heat and mix in orange juice and zest. Let cool and enjoy! Store inan air-tight container in the refrigerator for 7-10 days.

*Feel free to add your own "mix-ins" i.e. raisins, cinnamon, ginger, etc.

Compassion and Consideration Tip – Take time during this coming holiday season to visit a friend in need.

During the upcoming holiday season, as our thoughts turn to family and friends, may I suggest we consider visiting someone we know who might need a visit. Let me share a story of an experience I recently had.

When I was growing up, my Mom encouraged me to try new things. One day, she asked me if I wanted a tape recorder. Since I loved recording and listening to music, I told her I did. My Mom then left my room without any explanation.

A few weeks later Mom came to me with a large gray and white case. It was heavy and bigger than most suitcases. She gave me the case and said, "Here's your accordion." I don't know how I confused tape recorder with accordion, but my life was about to change.

Mom arranged for me to take accordion lessons from a neighbor, who I will call Maria. Maria was born in Pocatello, but her family was from Spain. Mom set up a schedule for me to practice every morning at 6:30 a.m. and have a lesson once a week at Maria's home.

Holding my accordion case with my right hand and leaning to my left to get the case off the ground, I carried my accordion up Maria's sidewalk to her front door for my lessons. Each week, Maria gave me songs to play and practice. Her favorite song was "Lady of Spain." Even at my young age, I sensed that it had a special meaning to her. Here are a couple of lines from Lady of Spain.

"Lady of Spain, I adore you. Right from the night I first saw you."

I met with Maria for my lessons for a few years. Then one day it ended. I don't remember when or why I stopped taking lessons. I suspect my mom recognized that my heart wasn't in it—all I wanted to do was play basketball. Even though I hadn't learned to play the accordion very well, I had made friends with Maria.

Marriage, family, church, career—I didn't see Maria often as the years passed. I reconnected with her a few years ago. As an Estate Planning Attorney, Maria came to me to have me review her Trust. I didn't see her after that for a few
